

**Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Report –
Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students**

HoHoKus School of Trade – (OPE ID 00849400) received education stabilization funds under Section 18004(a)(1) of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (“CARES Act”), Public Law No: 116-136. This Fund Report applies to the student portion received under the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund that is designated exclusively for emergency financial aid grants to students.

The institution appreciates that Congress and the President have made these critical funds available for eligible students who have expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the coronavirus pandemic. We take receipt of these federal funds seriously and are distributing them in accordance with the CARES Act and implementing guidance.

The institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. The institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.

1. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution’s Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is **\$241,664.00**.
2. The total amount of emergency financial aid grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of this Fund Report is **\$0**.
3. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to

participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, and thus eligible to receive emergency financial aid grants under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act, as of the date of this Fund Report is 179.

4. The total number of students who have received an emergency financial aid grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of this Fund Report is **0**.

We take receipt of these federal funds seriously and are distributing them in accordance with the CARES Act and implementing guidance as stated below:

Students will be required to complete an application for the Emergency Financial Aid grants to students.

The first application period ends on May 22, 2020.

Students must have a FAFSA on file and must be Title IV eligible.

Students must certify on the application that they have incurred expenses due to the Coronavirus pandemic, such as housing, food, technology, childcare, insurance expenses.

Students must have been actively enrolled on March 13, 2020 through May 22, 2020.

Once the application deadline is over, the institution will review all applications. Students that certified they have incurred expenses due to the pandemic will be eligible for an emergency grant.

The institution will provide an equal grant amount to all eligible applicants. The institution will not base eligibility on past financial needs (Pell eligibility). It is our belief that financial need for many of our students has changed drastically due to the pandemic.

After review and eligibility is determined, an emergency fund check will be delivered to the student directly at the campus.
